



Pennecon Indigenous Scholarship Program

Scholarship Program - Overview

Pennecon is committed to encouraging the growth and development of Indigenous representation within the province of Newfoundland and Labrador. To assist this, Pennecon will provide **two (2)** scholarships, each valued at **two thousand – five hundred dollars (\$2500.00)**, to two eligible Indigenous students pursuing post-secondary education (of any discipline) or a program in the trades.

The deadline for receipt of applications is **May 15**, **2023**, as noted on the application form and below.

Scholarship Assessment Criteria:

The criteria determining the winners of the scholarships will be as follows:

- Academic standing;
- Volunteer experience;
- Community involvement with NL Indigenous Community

Required Documentation for Scholarship Application:

- Be of Indigenous descent (First Nations, Inuit, or Metis);
- A completed application form;
- Proof of enrollment or acceptance to a post-secondary institution or trades program;
- A copy of your most recent high school transcript (first year post-secondary students only), or your most recent copy of College/University transcript;
- A cover letter outlining applicant's community involvement and interest in post-secondary education;
- An up-to-date resume;
- Proof of membership, or a letter from your Council or governing organization demonstrating a connection to an Indigenous community within Newfoundland and Labrador

Eligibility Requirements:

This scholarship will be awarded to an applicant who:

- Is a community member of an Indigenous group residing in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador (Note: Applicant does not need to be currently living in referenced community)
- Is able to provide proof of enrollment at a recognized post-secondary educational institution or trades program, indicating their full-time status (Whether it be current, or upcoming within the next calendar year);
- Is considered to be in good academic standing at time of application;
- Has submitted all required documents for consideration as stated above.

Application Procedure:

- 1.) Complete Pennecon Indigenous Scholarship Application Forms (available through Indigenous community representatives)
- 2.) Send all required forms (application form and required documentation) to the email address below:

- 3.) Applicants will receive a reply email acknowledging receipt of their application.
- 4.) Application deadline on May 15, 2023.
- 5.) All scholarships will be awarded before May 31, 2023.

Pennecon scholarships will be awarded at the sole discretion of the company, based on the scholarship criteria below. The Executive Vice President, HR & Corporate Support will select the scholarship committee. This committee will comprise of a representative of HR and at least two (2) designated employees from Pennecon. No member of the committee will have a dependent applying for a scholarship.
